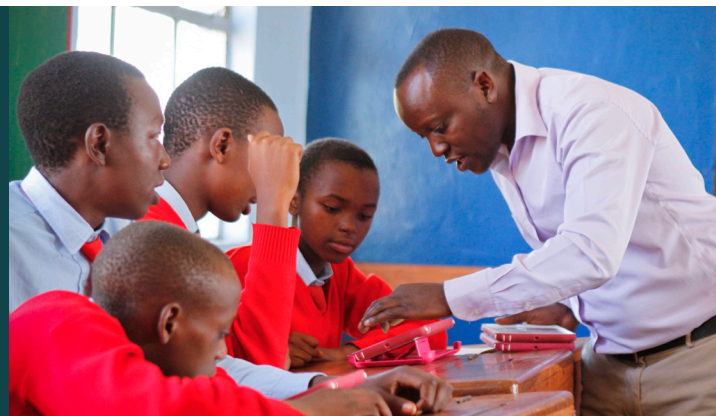

## Background

In the multi-ethnic savannah on the edge of the Serengeti National Park in Northern Tanzania, TeachUNITED (TU) schools typically serve between 350 to 800 students. Teachers regularly manage up to 75 children in a classroom, and many students and teachers must walk more than an hour each day to attend school. 78% of households served live below the poverty line of \$1.25/day. In Tanzania, TU is working to equip teachers with skills and resources to increase the number of students who pass the Form IV exam, which determines if students can continue with their secondary studies and beyond.

## Student & Teacher Impact

### National Exams:

- Secondary school promotion rates:
  - ⌚ **74% increase** for all students
  - ⌚ **2X increase** for girls

### STEM subject pass rates increased:

- ⌚ **204% in math**
- ⌚ **100% in science**

Primary school scores increased in ranking to **top 17 percentile** from top 43 percentile.

### TU students reported:



**double-digit increases**

over non-TU peers in 21st-Century and life skills such as *collaboration, creative thinking, & perseverance.*
